Therapist Movie Day 19 May 2017: Zootopia Teacher Questions

(1) Overview:

What did the movie teach you? Draw a picture or write a few sentences?

(2) Jobs:

- (a) The rabbit wanted to be a police officer, what is your dream job?
- (b) What other types of jobs did you see in the movie? (Singer, farmer, baker, receptionist, Meyer, Licencing Officer)

(3) Work Ethic:

(a) What do the sloths teach us about our school work and jobs one day?
(The sloths teach us to be patient with ourselves and to try our best to work faster so we can go to the next grade. The sloths teach us to stay on task / focused, not be distracted by jokes during work time)

(4) Bullying:

Both Judy and Nick were bullied.

- (a) Did Gideon stay a bully, or did he change?
- (b) What did Gideon do to show he had changed? (he apologised, really meaning it, and this was shown through his actions toward her saying sorry)
- a. <u>First Explain</u>: Teachers to please explain the difference between responding and reacting: <u>Reacting</u> is acting <u>without</u> thinking, <u>responding</u> is thinking <u>before</u> you act – respond is a word taken from the word **respon**sibility "respond-ability").
- b. Who was responding and who was reacting to the bullying? Answer: Judy (response was positive), Nick's reaction (reaction was negative)
 - Foundation Phase Question Judy, the rabbit, was bullied in the beginning of the move, what was her response?
 - Intermediate Phase Question –Nick, the Fox, was bullied by the Scouts when he was young, what was his reaction?
- c. When someone swears your mother, *do you have to accept their words or not*? (The bunny did not, the fox did)
- d. (<u>Senior Classes</u> to have an open discussion about bullying, discrimination, stereotypes, xenophobia, personal boundaries all in the movie (Example on privacy and boundaries: the scene involving the sheep whose wool was touched teaches us we cannot just touch another person. We respect their bodies like we do ours, privacy boundaries)
